



## **Jubilee Field Community Group**

The last year has been a productive year in Jubilee Field with many improvements and maintenance taking place to ensure it is an enjoyable space for Parishioners to visit.

The Frog Lane entrance had a new footpath installed with a handrail making access easier. Everyone agreed it was a great improvement!

The Sustainability Group were donated a small shed which has been positioned in Jubilee Field car park. The group levelled the shed, installed shelves and gave it a fresh coat of paint. Now parishioners can recycle items not readily available at the kerb side or supermarkets, including Pringle tubes, pens, toothbrushes, coffee pods and some ink cartridges.

The Parish Council have provided a noticeboard to be positioned in the car park entrance. Now the field is drying out the noticeboard will be installed.

The maintenance agreement was agreed by Parish Council up to October 2025 and the group & volunteers were thanked for all they do.

The entrance from the car park into the field had become slippery so some gravel grids were inserted and filled with gravel which has solved the problem.

The group decided not to have a table at the Annual Parish Meeting, but we did send a copy of the JFCG Chairmans Report.

Help Out Days are still not as popular as we would like despite now having a mailing list to email volunteers directly with information, but we do have a couple of new volunteers who are a great help!

The lavender beds were looking tired and the weed membrane had perished so we replaced the rotten wooden boards, put down a new heavy duty membrane, planted new lavender bushes and topped with a ton of gravel.

A lovely evening was had for the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of D-Day Beacon event. Music from the period played, Parishioners bought their own picnics and enjoyed a glorious sunset.

We were very grateful to David Adkins who arranged for himself and Dick Dyer to flail the very large patch of brambles.

Huge thanks again to Stu Nicholls for collecting our non-compostable waste and for arranging for Will Nichols to cut the Townsend Lane hedge and bank free of charge.
